Objections to Questions

Ambiguous	 Question may be interpreted in more than one way Question that doesn't contain certain facts to seek a specific answer
Argument of credibility	Facts are yet to be made nor there are reasons to believe or not
Argumentative	 Situations where the attorney isn't asking but arguing or discussing with the witness The attorney isn't seeking information but hinder the witness performance The attorney displays lack of respect towards the witness
Assumption of not proven facts	Questions or facts that haven't been proven
Captious	 Question made with artifice or deception that may affect the witness's recall of the events May lead to errors May include affirmations previously denied by the witness or denials previously affirmed by the witness
Improper characterization	Question where the defendant may be classified as something because of their behavior (ej. greedy)
Argue doctrine or invented jurisprudence	The opposing attorney is using untrue information
Composed	 Incorporates multiple information Asks more that one thing at the time
Conclusive	Testimony requires to be based on personal experience (except for an expert witness)
Confusive	 Question without clear terms Request's declaration of something not understood
Hearsay	Objection to evidence that relies on secondhand information rather than firsthand knowledge.
Speculative	When the witness is led to formulate hypothesis or it encourages the witness to guess the facts

Lack of foundation	When a party asks a question without showing to the court why the witness is qualified to answer
Irrelevant	The fact shown does not influence or is not relevant to the case.
Narrative	The question asks the witness to relate a story rather than state specific fact
Unresponsive	 An answer that is does not directly respond to a question An answer that goes beyond what's necessary to response
Personal Opinion	Instead of asking a question gives a personal point of view
Repetitive	The question has already been asked
Professional Secrecy	Violates professional secrecy
Incompetent Witness	The witness is disqualified by statute from testifying due to: • Age • Lack of Knowledge • Mental Illness
Leading	The question suggests the answer
Inmaterial Answer	The answer has not logical bearing on an issue in the case
Beyond the Scope	Addresses matters not covered on direct examination
